

Radipole Primary School Primary Sports Premium Funding

What is the Sports Premium?

The government has provided funding for the last two years to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses of the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport.
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs

Radipole Primary School received £10,126 for the 2014/15 academic year. The planned use of the PE and school sport funding at Radipole Primary School will be effective in improving and sustaining our high quality PE and sports provision. It will ensure that our pupils benefit from an on-going legacy of enriched sport, exercise and keeping healthy.

The four objectives of the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding are:

- To improve the quality of existing PE teaching through continuing professional learning in PE for generalists, so that all primary pupils improve their health, skills and physical literacy and have broader exposure to a range of sports.
- To increase participation levels in competitive sport and healthy activity of pupils and maintain these into adolescence.
- To increase the quality of initial teacher training in PE and sport, and to promote PE specialisation in primary level workforce
- For schools to show that they understand and value the benefits of high quality PE and sport, including its use as a tool for whole school improvement.
